

### **Language of teaching**

The official language of teaching at the University of Cyprus is Greek.

It is advisable that students have at least a basic knowledge in Greek. If they don't they are advised to attend the Greek intensive courses offered at the School of Modern Greek of the University.

If they do not speak Greek they are expected to have knowledge of English up to level B1 at least.

They should send along with their application documents a TOEFL, IGCSE or other similar examinations. In case these are not available the students may present a certificate from the home university which can verify his/her knowledge of English Language.

The School of Economics is the only School of the University currently offering more than one courses in English. Some other departments of the University offer one or two courses in English but not a full programme.

Incoming Erasmus students have the possibility to do assignments or even tutorials in English as many foreign students have done in the past **provided they agree this with the academics in their departments.**

There is bibliography in English and hence students should ask the academics teaching the subject they are interested to provide titles in English if available.
