## INTRODUCTION

---

This publication lists the research activity of the Faculty of Letters of the University of Cyprus undertaken between 2005-2007. It is the first time that the publication on the research activity is presented separately for each faculty of the University of Cyprus. The book presents information for each member of the Faculty's academic staff that is directly or indirectly related to research, such as membership in professional societies, international organizations or editorial boards, and participation in research programmes. The internal research programmes listed in this publication are programmes that have been approved by the Senate of the University of Cyprus.

Publications make up a sizeable part of the book and only published books, chapters and articles are included, while publications "in press" or "forthcoming" are not. The number of journal publications and conference proceedings is limited to a selection of the best ten publications by each member of the academic staff. For the first time, research profiles also include a new optional category named "distinguished publications", which includes a maximum of three selected publications before 2005 that are considered by members of the academic staff to be of high importance for their academic career.

Moreover, the number of authors in all publications is limited to three. In cases when authors are more than three, the symbol "et al" signifies that the member of the academic staff is listed first in the publication title, but a number of other not-listed authors also exist. The symbol "..." signifies that the member of the academic staff is listed second or third in the publication title, but a number of other not-listed authors also exist. Regarding electronic publications, only those accessible through a website are listed.

Members of the academic staff are listed in alphabetical order within departments and the information outlined in all research profiles is based on electronic data received directly from members of the academic staff.

### **The book contains three appendices:**

- Appendix I lists all the doctoral titles awarded by the Faculty of Letters within the period 2005-2007.
- Appendix II presents a list of abbreviated terms listed in this publication.
- Appendix III lists an index of the academic staff of the Faculty of Letters in alphabetical order by surname.

The Faculty of Letters at the University of Cyprus was established in 1996 as part of the institutional development of the Department of Greek Studies, Philosophy and History. Three institutes also function under its umbrella: the School of Modern Greek, the Cultural Centre of the University of Cyprus and the Archeological Research Unit.

Through its academic and research programmes, the scientific publications of its members and its broader scholarly and cultural activities, the Faculty of Letters covers the areas of History, Archaeology, Philology and Philosophy.

With a series of research programmes, the Faculty delves more thoroughly into the academic fields covered by these scholarly disciplines, discovering new evidence and suggesting new approaches that have contributed to the progress of academic scholarship and have received international acclaim.

The research activities of the Faculty of Letters are supported by the University of Cyprus as well as other research centres in Cyprus, the European Union and worldwide. In this context, the Faculty's academic staff head or participate in a number of important research programmes, participating in research missions and cooperating with some of the major archival centres and libraries in Greece and throughout the world.

Some of the research programmes cover the following disciplines:

- **Department of Byzantine and Modern Greek Studies:** Publications on modern appreciation of Byzantine and Medieval texts, publications on the appreciation of modern Greek authors, the compilation of a database for the study of Cyprus within medieval and renaissance sources, the writing of a dictionary of the modern Cypriot dialect, writing of a Modern History of Cyprus Literature as well as specialized subjects like the meaning and function of artistic interpretation in literature and painting.

- **Department of Classics and Philosophy:** Papyrology, palaeography, codicography, critical editions, electronic dictionaries, the study of the Cypriot and Cretan idioms and dialects.
  - **Department of History and Archaeology:** Preparation of management plans for historic and geographic areas in Cyprus, history and archaeology of medicine, palaeopathology and palaeoradiology, establishment of historic museums and archives, the design of digital libraries, the study of the Ancient Near East and the Eastern Mediterranean, the study of culture, tradition and songs of Azofiki and Marioupolis, arts and crafts in Thrace, Aegean Sea and Cyprus, Byzantine-Arabic relations, Cyprus during World War II.

Since its establishment, the Faculty of Letters has marked a steady progress; the achievements of its faculty members, through their research studies and publications, have received international recognition.

The research activities of the Department of Byzantine and Modern Greek Studies cover a wide spectrum of philological and linguistic research ranging from fundamental traditional approaches to the modern theoretical and explanatory methods of reading literary texts. More specifically, the Department is involved in research in the subjects of Byzantine Philology, Modern Greek Literature, Theory of Literature, Comparative Literature and Linguistics.

In this context, the Department runs the following research projects:

1. A new critical edition of the medieval Chronicle of Cyprus by Leontios Machairas
2. A new critical edition of the poetical work of Vasilis Michailides
3. Editorial matters on concerning C.P. Cavafy's work
4. Cyprus in Medieval and Renaissance sources
5. The concept and function of artistic representation in literature and painting
6. History of Cyprus Literature
7. Ioakeim Kyprios' Struggles (editio princeps)
8. Syntychies: An on-line dictionary of Cyprus Greek

Moreover, the Department has shown significant research activity during the period under review, which is represented in the publications of Department members (published books, chapters in collective volumes and publications in journals or conference proceedings).

In addition, the Department members have organized or participated in international conferences and collaborated with a number of research centres and foreign universities, such as the Universities of Athens, Thessaloniki, Sorbonne (Paris IV), Rome (La Sapienza), Napoli, Palermo, Venice, Oxford, Cambridge and King's College, Canada.

## DEPARTMENT OF CLASSICS AND PHILOSOPHY

The Department's research activities, because of the nature of the subject-matter studied, cover a wide range of scholarly fields in the study of the Greco-Roman antiquity and philosophy. More specifically, the research interests of the members of the academic staff of the Department are as follows:

1. **Ancient Greek Literature:** Homer, archaic lyric poetry, Attic tragedy, comedy, historiography, the sophists, computers and the humanities, reception of antiquity in modern times, epigram, Hellenistic literature, papyrology, ancient lexicography, epistolography
2. **Latin Literature:** Cicero and the Ciceronian age (literature and culture), Latin funeral speeches, Roman historiography, Greco-Roman political thought, Roman grammarians and scholars, Roman archaism, Augustan poetry, literature of the early imperial period, satire, rhetoric, epistolography
3. **Linguistics:** Greek dialects, koine, sociolinguistics, electronic lexicography
4. **Epigraphy:** syllabic scripts in the Greek speaking world, Greek inscriptions from Macedonia and Cyprus
5. **Methodology and History of Classical Literature:** palaeography, textual criticism and editing of ancient texts, I/T and classical studies, technology and education
6. **Philosophy:** The Presocratics, Ancient Greek Philosophy (Plato, Aristotle), political philosophy, moral philosophy with emphasis on applied ethics and the ethics of life, German idealism, philosophy of science, logic.

Cyprus takes a central place in the research of the Department, with the recent edition of the "Ancient Cypriot Philosophers" as a characteristic example.

Members of the Department participate in research projects conducted by the C.N.R.S. in France, the National Research Foundation in Greece, the Centre for the Greek Language in Greece, the Association Internationale d'Etudes du Sud-Est Europeen, the Academy of Athens, the University of Athens, the Aristotle University of Thessaloniki, the University of Genova, the Open University in Greece, the University of Heidelberg, the Deutsche Forschungsgemeinschaft (Universities of Munich and Cologne) and the Katholieke Universitat Leuven in Belgium. Some research activities of members of staff in this Department are supported by research centres abroad and are sponsored by research

projects of the European Union and by organizations based both in Cyprus and abroad. Members of staff also contribute to international publications, such as *Nomina Romana*, *L'Annee Epigraphique*, *Der Neue Pauly*, *Gnomon*, *The Classical Review* etc. Furthermore, some members of the academic staff are on the advisory board for certain scholarly publishers, such as *Skepsis* (Athens) and *Philosophical Inquiry* (Thessaloniki).

Members of the academic staff also participate, often as invited speakers, in the most prestigious international conferences of their research areas, they publish books and articles in international journals, and they edit collected papers and proceedings of international conferences. During the period covered by the present edition, this Department has organized international conferences, symposia or scholarly meetings on classical literature, philosophy and Greek linguistics; the proceedings of these meetings either have either already appeared or are in press. The Department has also hosted several lectures given by distinguished speakers from abroad and by its academic staff.

## DEPARTMENT OF HISTORY AND ARCHAEOLOGY

---

The Department of History and Archaeology is the leader in the scientific investigation of the history and archaeology of Cyprus, which consequently has become the focus of increasing international scholarly attention. The Department also plays a fundamental role in research on the past of the wider Eastern Mediterranean basin, from prehistory to the present, and contributes to the study of Western Europe as well. The Department hosts international conferences on a regular basis, averaging three or four per year from 2005 to 2007, and members of the Department frequently co-organize conferences abroad. In addition, the Archaeological Research Unit has a weekly lecture series, and the Department's postgraduate programme in Byzantine Studies (in partnership with the Department of Byzantine and Modern Greek Studies) runs a bi-weekly colloquium with scholarly presentations. Members of the academic staff of the Department conduct and participate in several archaeological excavations both in Cyprus and the Aegean, and historians and archaeologists are engaged in a host of other scientific activities, including serving on a dozen editorial boards in eight countries.

These efforts are reflected in the impressive publication record of the Department of History and Archaeology between the years 2005 and 2007. Faculty members authored or edited a dozen books, and the selected chapters, journal articles, and published conference papers listed in the pages to follow, while only a portion of the Department's total output, still number nearly one hundred. These writings, about 60% of which concern Cyprus, appeared in seven languages in publications produced in 14 different countries. Three new postgraduate programmes began functioning in this period, and it is expected that the Department's PhDs will make substantial contributions to scholarship, as do the Department's research associates.

In addition to a number of individual and collaborative research projects of varying sizes, the Department of History and Archaeology is involved in many fully-funded research programmes. In the years 2005-2007, the University of Cyprus funded eight research programmes of faculty members of the Department concerning Byzantine prosopography, Cypriot watermills, the

compatibility of development and preservation, British involvement in independent Cyprus, prehistoric pottery, a digital map of Palaepaphos, the writings of the last Greek pope and papal letters concerning Greece. Faculty members are also in charge of or participate in over 30 externally funded research programmes. Too numerous to list here, they include the history and archaeology of medicine to the Byzantine material heritage of the Eastern Mediterranean and Cyprus and World War II.
