Solon Xenopoulos is an Architect, Graduate of the School of Architecture, National University of Athens (1966), with postgraduate Studies at the Bartlett School of Architecture and Planning UCL: Course Advanced Architectural Studies in the field of "The Architecture of Cinematic Space (1984-1986)".

He has been a Professor at the Department of Architectural Language, Communication and Design of the School of Architecture of the National Technical University of Athens (1974-2010), Director of the Department of Architectural Language, Communication and Design of the School of Architecture of the National Technical University of Athens (2002-2004), Visiting Professor of the Department of Architecture of the University of Cyprus (2008 Fall), Professor at the Department of Architecture of the University of Nicosia (2011-2014).

In 2011 he was awarded the title of Professor Emeritus of the National Technical University of Athens.

Since 2009 he has been teaching at the Interdepartmental Postgraduate Programme "Architecture – Spatial Design", Unit: Design – Space – Culture of the National Technical University of Athens

He is currently teaching at the Department of Architecture and Environmental Sciences of the School of Architecture, Engineering Land and Environmental Sciences of Neapolis University in Pafos. In June 2014 he was appointed as the Dean of the School.

He worked as an Architect in London (1967-1975), whereas from 1975-1992 he had his own practice in Athens.

Since 1993 he is senior partner at the Architectural Office "Solon Xenopoulos – Eleni Hadjinicolaou, Architects" in Athens.

He has numerous publications of theoretical and professional works in referred Journals. In June 2014 he published the book titled: "Should Space be blamed for everything?" Scattered texts on Architecture" (University of Nicosia Editions).
