## Decentralised interiorities: The new constitutional charter for welfare provision infrastructures by social movements in Athens during the years of crisis

*This presentation closely investigates the spatial dynamics of the welfare provision activities - such as for food, shelter, healthcare and education- by social movements in Athens, by focusing on the solidarity clinics and pharmacies that provide medical and pharmaceutical care to marginalised groups, as a way to understand how the clinic as infrastructure creates different relations between subjects and the city. For that purpose, it reviews and interrogates the Constitutional Charter of Common Principles of the Solidarity Clinics and Pharmacies (2013) that led to the formation of the healthcare social movement, to speak about the larger solidarity movement as a system and the interplay with the state institutions, a fact that reached high levels of consolidation during the SYRIZA government (2015-2019).*
