Richard Stibbard received his BA from the University of Exeter, MA from the University of Birmingham, and PhD from the University of Reading.

He has published in various academic journals including *Journal of the Acoustical Society of America*, *Language, Culture and Curriculum*, *International Review of Applied Linguistics*, and *Journal of the International Phonetic Association*.

He held a post as Assistant Professor at the Department of Foreign Languages and Literatures, University of Cyprus, from September 2002 to August 2003, during which time he taught on the BA in English Language and Literatures. Modules taught were English Phonetics and Phonology, History of the English Language, and Introduction to Linguistics.

In addition, he acted as personal and academic tutor to undergraduate students, and took on various administrative duties including faculty representative on the University Computing and Equipment Committee, coordinator of the acoustics phonetics laboratory, recording studio and language laboratory, and coordinator of department computer equipment. He was also department website coordinator.

After leaving the University of Cyprus, he joined the Applied Linguistics Research Group at the University of Surrey, where he taught on the MA in Applied Linguistics (TESOL) and MSc ELT Management programmes.

He now works for himself teaching English pronunciation, web development, and aspects of Chinese language online.
