

## ERASMUS+ PROGRAMME

### LANGUAGE OF TEACHING AT THE UNIVERSITY OF CYPRUS

#### **Language of teaching**

The official language of teaching at the University of Cyprus is Greek.

It is advisable that students have at least basic knowledge in Greek.

Students STRONGLY advised to attend the Greek intensive courses offered at the School of Modern Greek of the University.

The requires knowledge of English is B2.

All students must send along with their application documents, official examination certificates as

- A TOEFL certificate
- An IELTS certificate
- A TOEIC certificate
- A Cambridge certificate
- IGCSE
- ESOL
- Oxford Test of English
- DAAD
- Any other internationally recognized English language certificates corresponding to CEFR Level B2 or higher.

**Certificates issued by the home universities and the OLS certificates will not be accepted.**

In the case the student is a native a native speaker of English we will need a copy of the identity card/passport.

If a student has successfully finished a study programme of at least one year which was completely taught in English, we can accept a certificate from the Director of the Study programme indicating this information.

**A GPA of 6.5/10** is required only for students nominated at the **Department of Computer Science**.

The School of Economics is the only School of the University currently offering a large number of courses in English. Most of the other departments of the University offer few courses in English

but not a full programme. Students may combine courses from departments of the same School and may also choose 1-2 courses from other Schools provided the majority of the courses is selected from the department with which the Erasmus + agreement exists.

In departments where there are no courses in English Erasmus students have the possibility to do assignments or even tutorials in English, **provided they agree this with the academics in their departments.**

There is bibliography in English and hence students should ask the academics teaching the subject they are interested in to provide titles in English **if available.**

### **Communication language**

Almost all people in the University and in the country in general speak English and nobody should have any communication problems.
