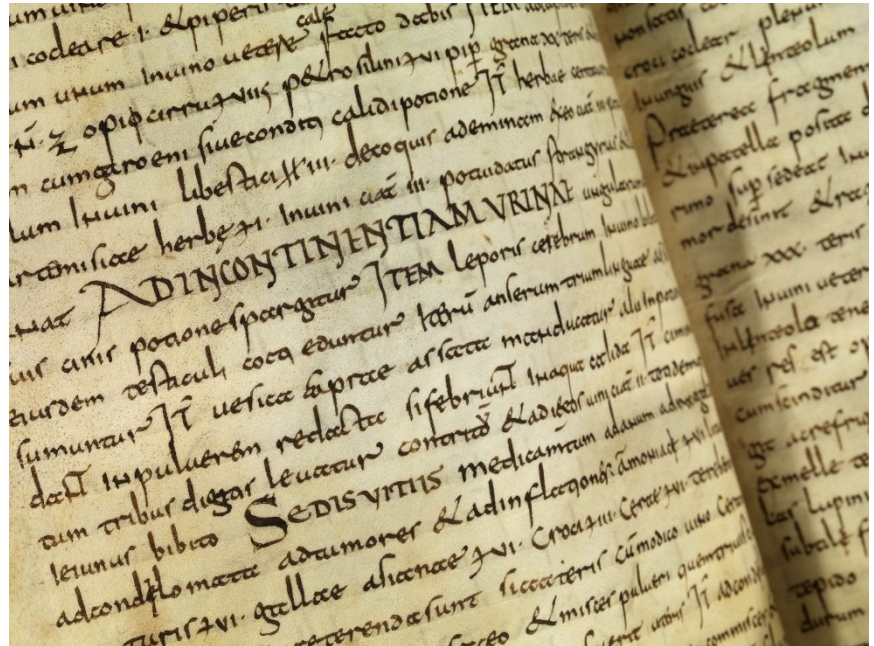

Short Presentation

This training is specifically designed by the Centre for Languages and Literature of ULUND to introduce the StoryPharm DCs to theories and methods of discourse analysis used to examine social discourses in different settings. DCs benefit from inspiring cross-disciplinary engagements, addressing discourse analysis alongside the history of medicine and narrative medicine. Taking the form of seminars and workshops, the training consists of theoretical and practical components. The theoretical component includes presentations of various discourse analysis methods and discussions of their fields of application. The practical component invites DCs to undertake independent discourse analyses by using sources from their individual projects. This training does not only provide DCs with new methodologies in approaching their sources, but it also offers knowledge applicable to non-academic careers.
